

CROSSRIDGE PRESERVATION ASSOCIATION, INC.

October 3, 2000

A special called board meeting was held at 7:30 at the home of president Robert and Willanna Ramsey with Bill Edwards, Terry Daniel and Rachel Allen in attendance.

The minutes were approved as presented.

Terry Daniel, treasurer, reported a balance of \$2,781.73 with all bills paid. The billing with BGMU is now in proper billing order.

Two companies submitted bids for the irrigation system: Taylor Lawn Irrigation and Landscaping \$900; Evergreen Service \$600. The members selected Evergreen to install the Bluebird irrigation system and to check on extending the sprinkler to cover the first island with a timer set for an early morning hour.

It was reported that Sandy Riley had resigned as chairman of the Beautification Committee. Jimmy Goodnight will continue to serve. A plan was presented from Villegas' Landscaping for the fall flowers and the spring planting. The members volunteered Charles Moody to help with the Fall selection of plants and to negotiate a small fee for the neighbors on the four corners to water the islands every two weeks. This is currently being done by Villegas for a fee of \$90 per month and will continue until other arrangements are made. The Fall planting is not to exceed \$300 and the Spring is \$200. The Spring selection was tabled and will be made at the next meeting.

The luminaries that had been discussed for use during Halloween were reconsidered and members voted they were too hazardous for the neighborhood. Terry Daniel volunteered to arrange for a Halloween display by October 15 at the front entranceway for \$100 or less. The Christmas display project will be completed by the President and Willanna with lighted GREETINGS or whatever they choose not to exceed \$200.

The tentative date for the CrossRidge yard sale was set for the following week after Derby Day with one ad being paid by the Association.

Paid membership dues were discussed and the number participating in the association is of great concern. How do we get members involved? This is a project to involve us all after the next newsletter and statement of dues.

Each member was asked to submit a brief article for the Newsletter.

The January 2001 meeting time and place will be announced later. Adjournment 9:00.

Neighbor Networking Scholarship Program

Sponsored by the City of Bowling Green Neighborhood Action Office

The City of Bowling Green is a member city of the Regional Neighborhood Network Conference. The RNNC's mission is to increase networking and education opportunities for neighborhood professionals and members of neighborhood organizations. The RNNC convenes annually, hosted by a member city, and features numerous seminars, speakers' luncheons, and neighborhood tours. First and foremost, the RNNC is a networking organization, creating a venue for the exchange of ideas during each year's events.

The City of Bowling Green will provide some scholarship assistance to qualifying applicants who wish to attend the RNNC. This year, the conference will be held at the Galt House in Louisville, KY, October 5-7. At minimum, the scholarship awards will cover the tuition cost for the conference itself. Typically, the conference fee includes some meals, the neighborhood tours, all seminars and official functions, as well as conference materials.

All neighborhood representatives and others interested in neighborhood issues are encouraged to attend—one need not qualify for a scholarship to go!

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS—

In order to apply for an RNNC scholarship, one must meet the following requirements.

- Must live within the city limits of Bowling Green
- Be at least 18 years of age, OR, if attending the youth conference, be accompanied by a parent, guardian, or chaperone approved in writing by the parent or guardian
- Must be willing to attend all official functions, seminars, and included neighborhood tour at the RNNC.

SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS DECISIONS—

First priority will be given to the following applicants:

- Applicants who are members of a registered, active neighborhood organization. Active means that the organization meets at least once per year. Organization registration forms may be downloaded from our website at www.bgky.org or may be mailed to you.
- Residents who hold elected office and/or otherwise hold leadership roles in their neighborhood organization.
- Residents of the Enterprise Community, as verified by a member of the EC Board of Directors.


Dear Bob:

The association has indicated a desire to continue to use the permanent metal meeting notice signs which I had made up back when I first assumed the presidency two years ago.

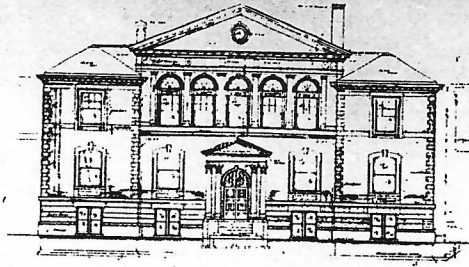
